Casting and Hiring Coordinator, October 2026 – Present (**Florida Studio Theatre**, Sarasota, FL). Responsible for overseeing all casting for more than a dozen yearly play, musical, and cabaret productions in addition the hiring of creative, production, and administrative theatre staff for a busy regional (LORT-D) theatre with a large administrative team and multiple productions running concurrently on five stages across its downtown Sarasota campus. Work extensively with theatrical agents and managers as well as directors and senior artistic staff (reporting directly to Producing Artistic Director Richard Hopkins) to ensure casting and hiring processes that are equitable, organized, efficient—always maintaining a deep and sincere respect for the individuality of the people involved.

Artistic Director / Producing Artistic Director, January 2023 – October 2026 (**Winnepesaukee Playhouse**, Meredith, NH). Responsible for the curation, implementation, and evaluation of programming for a busy year-round professional (non-equity) theatre with a yearly operating budget of \$1m. This includes a professional summer stock season as well as education and community theatre programming. Responsible for hiring and designing/implementing management policies and procedures for actors, creative teams, and other staff. Served as a primary public face of the organization, interacting with a variety of supporters and stakeholders. Lead role in managing individual giving and other fundraising campaigns. One of two executive leadership positions (with Managing Director) reporting directly to the Playhouse Board of Trustees. **In April 2025**, the Playhouse's Managing Director stepped down to pursue another opportunity within the company and the Board of Trustees restructured the organization to create a single board-reportable executive, the Producing Artistic Director. This position included all of the original position's duties and added responsibility for finance (planning, oversight, reporting), facilities (maintenance, capital improvements, relationships with vendors and contractors), development (major donor relations) and direct oversight of contracts/agreements and payroll.

Director of Education, January 2014 – December 2022 (**Winnepesaukee Playhouse**, Meredith, NH). Responsible for designing, implementing, and evaluating all educational programming at the Playhouse, a year-round professional and community theatre. This included approximately four productions per year plus summer camps, talkbacks, backstage tours, and other programs aimed at fostering engagement. Served as a member of the Playhouse's senior staff and core leadership team.

Teaching Lecturer (Adjunct Faculty), January 2015 – May 2025 (**Plymouth State University**, Plymouth NH). Classes taught: Introduction to Theatre, Theatrical Experience, Acting 1, Acting 3, Arts Management / Stage Management, Audition Techniques, Script Analysis, Acting Company. Regular director in departmental season.

Lecturer (Adjunct Faculty), February 2013 – December 2017 (**Keene State College**, Keene NH).
